

The State Soil Conservation Board met in Temple on Monday, May 29th, 1939.

After being duly sworn, and taking the Constitutional oath as is required of State officers, the Board, at executive session, transacted the following business:

On motion of Mr. H. K. Fawcett, seconded by Mr. Walter Cardwell, V. C. Marshall was elected as Chairman of the Board, the motion being put by Mr. W. G. Kennedy.



Walser, State Co-ordinator, Soil Conservation Service, College Station, Texas, it was moved by Mr. W. G. Kennedy that the Board as a whole visit the states of Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma for the purpose of studying the set-up and conditions in those States as are operating under State Soil Conservation Laws, to make observation and gain such information as would be helpful to the Texas Board in putting into operation the State Soil Conservation Law in Texas.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned to meet Monday, June 5, 1939 in Temple, Texas.
