



## TEXAS STATE SOIL CONSERVATION BOARD

January 17, 1951.

The State Soil Conservation Board met at the Baker Hotel, in Mineral Wells, Texas, on the evening of January 17, 1951, with the following members present;

C.M. Caraway, Sr., Chairman, Horace K. Fawcett, J.P. Martin, S.J. Payne and E.W. Wehman. Others present were, V.C. Marshall, Executive Director, Howard H. Goss and John B. Cole.

The minutes of the meeting held in Fort Stockton, Texas, November 27, 1950, were read and approved.

A Determination of Need for a Soil Conservation District in Terrell County to be known as the Rio Grande-Pecos River District No. 237, was approved upon motion made by H K Fawcett, seconded by J P Martion.

The Board discussed the request that they had made in January 1950, at their Galveston meeting for a Memorandum of Understanding with the Soil Conservation Service as nothing had developed from that request. After the discussion the following action was taken;

"A motion was made by Horace K. Fawcett, seconded by E.W. Wehman, motion was unanimously approved; That V.C. Marshall, Executive Director be requested to communicate with Paul H. Walsler, State Conservationist of the Soil Conservation Service as to when a definite commitment would be made on the Board's request of January, 1950, for a Memorandum of Understanding with the Soil Conservation Service, and that a copy of the request be mailed to Louis P. Merrill, Regional Conservator."

A letter from the Chamber of Commerce of Tyler, Texas, inviting the Board to designate Tyler as the meeting place of the Association in 1952, was read and filed.

No further business appearing for attention the Board adjourned at 10 p.m.
