The State Soil Conservation Board met in its office, Temple, Texas, March 29, 1954, at 8 o'clock a.m., with the following present; S J Payne, Chairman, E W Wehman and A F Leesch. Others present were V C Marshall, Executive Director; A C Spencer and O F Armstrong, Planning Engineers for the Board and H B Boswell of the Soil and Water Magazine.

The Minutes of the Board Meeting held February 8, 1954, were read and approved.

Mr Marshall reported on the Public Hearing held in Hartley County, March 11, 1954, as to whether it should be annexed to Dallam County District or organize a separate District. It was decided by the meeting that a separate District would be requested. A Determination of Need for the formation of a District in Hartley County was approved.

The receiving of a Petition for a new District to be composed of Randall and part of Potter Counties was reported.

Mr Payne and Mr Spencer reported on their attendance at the National Meeting of Soil Conservation District Supervisors in New Orleans.

The holding of the election for a State Board Member in State District Number One on May 5, 1954, was discussed and the holding of same in Plainview was approved.

The Board then adjourned and in a body proceeded to the farm of Clinton Harbers, near West Point, Texas, to inspect the soil building practices used on said farm which had caused increased production.
