

MINUTES OF STATE BOARD MEETING ON APRIL 23rd, 1941

The State Soil Conservation Board met at the Lamar Hotel, Houston, Texas, April 23rd, at 9 a.m. Members present: Chairman Walter W. Cardwell, Wm. G. Kennedy, H. K. Fawcett, J. P. Martin, and C. M. Caraway.

This Board Meeting was called by the Chairman as a result of an invitation by Mr. Jack Shelton, General Agent, Farm Security Administration, as a general conference with representative Federal Agencies cooperating in the furtherance of the Texas Soil Conservation Program.

Called to order by the Chairman, the Board discussed general routine matters, and on motion of Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Caraway, it was ordered that the Piney Woods Soil Conservation District, No. 429, be given an extension of two days for filing nominating petitions for Supervisors.

On motion by Mr. Caraway, seconded by Mr. Kennedy, May 10th, 1941 was designated as the date for election in Eldorado Divide and Upper Sabine Soil Conservation Districts for the purpose of determining whether or not the landowners approve the creation of a Soil Conservation District in the respective areas as petitioned.

On motion of Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Fawcett, it was ordered that elections be held on May 10th, 1941 for the election of Supervisors in the following Districts:

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned, and the remainder of the day was spent in general conference with Federal Agencies.
