

MINUTES OF TEXAS STATE SOIL CONSERVATION BOARD MEETING AUGUST 3, 1945

The State Soil Conservation Board met in it's offices at Temple, Texas, August 3, 1945 at 9:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Walter W. Cardwell, other members present were J. P. Martin, H. K. Fawcett, S. J. Payne. Others present at the meeting were V. C. Marshall, Administrative Officer, and Paul H. Walser, State Conservationist, Soil Conservation Service. The minutes of the June 7th meeting were read and approved. The Determination of Need for the creation of a soil conservation district in Donley County was considered also the annexation of additional territory to the Toyah-Limpia Soil Conservation District. It was determined that there was need in the interest of general health, safety and welfare for a soil conservation district to function in these areas. Elections having been held in the following proposed soil conservation districts - Frio County, Gray County, and Dimmit County and the Winter Garden district composed of Zavalla County and part of Dimmit County and these elections having carried by the required 2/3 of those voting, it was determined that a soil conservation district in each of these proposed areas is administratively practicable and feasible.

The lease for office space occupied by the State Board which has been signed by Boyd, Cox & Cox, lessors, was approved by the Board and signed covering the period from September 1, 1945 to August 31, 1947.

The petitions for the annexation to the Southmost District & Willacy-Hidalgo District were presented and discussed but no action was taken.

There being no further business the Board adjourned at 12 noon.
