August 30, 1946.

The Texas State Soil Conservation Board met in its offices at Temple, Texas, on August 30, 1946, at 8:30 a.m.

Members present were C.M.Caraway, Chairman, J.P.Martin, Horace K. Fawcett and S.J.Payne. Others present were V.C.Marshall, Executive Director, Howard H. Goss, A.L.Liles, Paul H. Walser, State Soil Conservationist and Dooley Dawson, Agricultural Representative of the Second National Bank, of Houston.

The minutes of the meeting of the Board held on July 12, 1946, were read and approved. On motion made by Horace K. Fawcett, seconded by J.P.Martin, the Determinatiof of Need for the creation of a Soil Conservation Districts in the following arears was approved; Salt Fork, No.123; Mason County, No.223; Starr County No.332; and the annexation of additional territory to Upper Leon, No. 525. On motion made by S.J.Payne, seconded by J.P.Martin, it was determined that the operation of Districts in the following arears is administratively practicable and feasible; Dallam County No.131; Hale County No.132; Edwards Plateau No.222; and Loma Blanca No.328.

The Annual Meeting of the Association of District Supervisors was then discussed and it was decided to hold same on December 10 and 11, 1946, in Austin, Texas.

No further business appearing for attention the Board adjourned at 11 a.m.
