



TEXAS STATE SOIL CONSERVATION BOARD

September 10, 1948.

The State Soil Conservation Board met in its office at Temple, Texas, June 10, 1948 at 8:30 a.m., with Horace K. Fawcett, Chairman presiding, J.P.Martin, W.W.Cardwell, C.M.Caraway and S.J.Payne. Also present were V.C.Marshall, Executive Director, Howard H. Goss, Louis B. Dawkins, John B. Cole, Paul H. Walser, State Conservationist.

The minutes of the last meeting held June 25, 1948, were read and approved.

The Board approved the Determination of Need for Trans-Pecos District No.231; Also the Determination of Practicability and Feasibility for the operation of a District in Ochiltree No.242, the vote being 390 to 18; and in High Point District No. 230.

The Board discussed the holding of the State Meeting of District Suoervisors for this year and it was decided to hold same on the 9th and 10th. of November, 1948, and that the meeting be held in Brownwood, Texas.

The employment of an Assistant Planning Engineer to replace Mr.A.C.Spencer, now stationed at Dublin, Texas, in State District No.5. Mr.Spencer having resigned to accept employment with Friends of the Land, came up for consideration. Mr.Marshall advised the Board that a number of men had been interviewed. Some declined because of former commitments and other reasons. He said that Mr. Jack Lynch, of Honey Grove had advised that he would accept. His background and qualifications had been throroughly checked and that he recommended his appointment effective as of October 1, 1948, at a salary of \$4,000.00 per year.Mr.Fawcett, requested Mr.Marshall to write a letter asking for a meeting with the State Committee of the P.M.A. to try to iron out and try to coordinate their work with the State Soil Conservation Districts.

No further business appearing for attention the Board adjourned at noon.
