The State Soil Conservation Board met in Brownwood, Texas, December 8, 1947, at 7:30 p.m., with following members present; J.P.Martin, Chairman, C.M.Caraway, Horace K. Fawcett, Walter W. Cardwell and S.J.Payne; Also present were V.C.Marshall, Executive Director; Howard H. Goss, Chief, Engineering and Planning; Louis B. Dawkins, Asst Planning Engineer; A.C.Spencer, Assistant Planning Engineer and John A. Sands Assistant Planning Engineer; W.E.Moncrief, President-Manager, State Association of District Supervisors, R.M.Roswell, G.K.Horton, Dan C. Sparks; Paul H. Walser, State Conservationist and P.G.Haines, Specialist of the Extension Service.

The minutes of the last meeting held at Temple, Texas, November 1, 1947, were read and approved.

A Public Hearing having been held in the Beattie Community in the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District and on the annexation of additional territory and in Wheeler County as to the need for a S.C.D. it was determined that there was need for the annexation and the organization of a District in these particular areas.

A referendum having been held in Parmer County, the vote being 190 to 0; it was therefore considered and determined that the operation of a Soil Conservation District in this area was practicable and feasible. A referendum having been held in part of Armstrong County on the proposition of being annexed to Staked Plains S.C.D., the vote being 113 to 0; it was so considered and determined; A referendum having been held in Sabine County on the proposition of being annexed to the Piney Woods S.C.D. 429, the vote being 209 to 8, it was ~~considered~~ so considered and determined. The inclusion of additional territory to the Upper Leon S.C.D. of the Beattie Community in Comanche County, there being less than one hundred land owners in the proposed annexation, it was so ~~determining~~ and also considered practicable and feasible.

No further business appearing for attention the Board adjourned at 8:30 p.m. and joined the Directors of the State Association of District Supervisors in a discussion of problems of Soil Conservation.
