

The State Soil Conservation Board met in the office of the State Board at Temple on March 21st, 1941, with all members present: Mr. Wm. G. Kennedy, Mr. H. K. Fawcett, Mr. Walter W. Cardwell, Mr. J. P. Martin, and Mr. C. M. Caraway.

The minutes of the December 20th meeting were read, and adopted as read.

The minutes of the January 20th meeting were read, and adopted as read.

On motion by Mr. Fawcett, seconded by Mr. Caraway, Determination of Need was made on the proposed Schleicher County Soil Conservation District No. 212.

The election returns on Childress and Cottle Counties voting to be made a part of the Hall County Soil Conservation District, No. 109, were canvassed and approved. A copy of these returns were made a part of these minutes. On motion by Mr. Kennedy, seconded by Mr. Martin, the addition of Childress and Cottle Counties to the Hall County Soil Conservation District No. 109, was determined to be Practicable and Feasible.

On motion by Mr. Caraway, seconded by Mr. Martin, Determination of Need was made on the proposed Upper Sabine Soil Conservation District, No. 530.

A committee from Hunt County appeared before the Board, asking that their district be given approval, and that they be granted an election at an early date.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned, to convene again on April 26th, 1941.
