The State Soil Conservation Board met in San Antonio, Texas, October 31, 1949, with the following present: S.J. Payne, Chairman, C.M. Caraway, Horace K. Fawcett and J.P. Martin; Others present; V.C. Marshall, Executive Director, Howard H. Goss, Chief of Engineering and Planning; Louis B. Dawkins, Jack F. Lynch, Assistant Planning Engineer; Paul H. Walser, State Soil Conservation Service and John B. Cole and G.G. Gibson, Director of the Extension Service, A&M College.

The Minutes of the last meeting held October 3, 1949, were read and approved.

A Determination ^{IF NEEDED} that the inclusion of additional territory in Comanche County to the Hamilton-Coryell Soil Conservation District NO. 506 was approved. A Determination of need ~~that~~ for the inclusion of territory in Glasscock County, not now in a S.C.D., to the North Concho Soil Conservation District No. 208, was approved. A Determination of need for the organization of a Soil Conservation District in all of Zapata County not now in a Soil Conservation District, was approved.

A Determination of need for a Soil Conservation District to be organized in Reagan County was considered and postponed indefinitely.

Mr. Marshall reported as to questions submitted to the Attorney General for his opinion on HB. No. 97. He also reported on a meeting held in Tahoka.

Mr. G.G. Gibson, Director of the Extension Service at A&M College was present and made a short talk expressing his desire to cooperate with the Board in every way possible.

The meeting adjourned at 10 p.m. to spend the next two days with District Supervisors in their annual meeting.
