



## TEXAS STATE SOIL CONSERVATION BOARD

SECOND FLOOR FIRST STATE BANK BUILDING

TEMPLE

November 4, 1947.

The State Soil Conservation Board met in its Offices in Temple, Texas, November 1, 1947, at 8:30 a.m., with the following present Horace K. Fawcett, C.M.Caraway, Walter W. Cardwell and S.J.Payne, Mr.V.C.Marshall, Howard H. Goss; Mr.J.P.Martin arriving soon after.

On motion by Mr.Cardwell, seconded by Mrs.Payne, Mr.Fawcett was designated as Chairman until the arrival of Mr.Martin. The minutes of the meeting of October 10, 1947, were read and approved.

A public Hearing having been held in Bandera County, at Bandera, on the 24th. day of October, 1947, said hearing being satisfactory to the State Board, for the organization of a Soil Conservation District, a motion was duly made that and passed that a Determination of Need for a Soil Conservation District in Bander County be approved and an election be ordered in this area.

A Referendum having been held in Running Water (Castro County), the vote being 75 to 4; and in Colorado County, the vote being 221 to 47, it was therefore considered and determined that the operation of Soil Conservation Districts in each of these areas would be administratively practicable and feasible,

Mr.Goss reported upon his visit to Maverick County to hold a Public Hearing saying that there being very little interest manifested, as only about six men were present, he suggested that the Hearing be postponed until a later time, probably in January, 1948.

Mr.Marshall advised the Board that a deficiency existed in the Mileage for District Supervisors account, and would also be a deficiency in the Per Diem account of District Supervisors. The Board instructed Mr.J.P. Martin, Chairman, to sign a request to the Governor for a Deficiency Appropriation to cover our present fund.

No further business appearing for attention the Board adjourned at 9 p.m.
