Dear Sir or Madam:

The Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board (TSSWCB) and Texas Institute for Applied Environmental Research (TIAER) cordially invite you and your neighbors to the final meeting regarding the Recreational Use Attainability Analysis (RUAA) for Dixon Creek. The meeting will be held June 12, 2014 at 6:00pm in Borger City Hall, located at 600 North Main Street Borger, TX 79008. A map to the meeting place is printed on the back of this invitation and a meeting agenda is enclosed.

Dixon Creek is currently listed on the *Texas 303(d) List* due to elevated levels of *E. coli*, an indicator bacteria found in warm-blooded animals. These indicator bacteria are used to identify the possible presence of pathogens that may increase the risk of illness when participating in primary contact recreation activities in the water body. Dixon Creek has a designated use of primary contact recreation based on the *Texas Surface Water Quality Standards* (TSWQS). Prior to June 2010, only two categories of recreational use existed in Texas. In June 2010, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) adopted revisions to the TSWQS that expanded the designation of contact recreation into three categories, while maintaining a fourth category of noncontact recreation. Water bodies listed as impaired for bacteria are now being studied to determine if primary contact recreation is the correct use or if another recreational use category may be more appropriate.

At this meeting, the final technical report for the RUAA field surveys and the historical information review will be presented. Your participation and input is fundamental to the success of this project.


