## Texas Well Owner Network

Geronimo and Alligator Creeks Watershed

The Texas Well Owner Network (TWON) program is a free, one-day educational training for residents who want to become familiar with groundwater sources, well and septic system maintenance, water quality and water treatment. The training will primarily focus on water quality issues in the Geronimo and Alligator Creeks Watershed as well as efforts by the Geronimo and Alligator Creeks Watershed Partnership, Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA), Texas Water Resources Institute and the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board to improve water resources in the area.

### Bring your well water samples:

Private well owners are independently responsible for monitoring the quality of their wells and are essentially the operators of their own water system. Well owners may bring a water sample to the training to be screened for nitrate, total dissolved solids (TDS), arsenic and radionuclides for \$10. For an additional \$10, Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority Regional Laboratory will test for *E. coli* bacteria. Pick up approved sample containers with instructions at the GBRA lab in Seguin, or at the Guadalupe and Comal County Extension offices. Bring samples and payment to the training.
