The State Soil Conservation Board met in Fort Worth at 9:00 A.M. on April 30, 1949. Present were S. J. Payne, Chairman; C. M. Caraway; W. W. Cardwell; and J. P. Martin. Others present were Howard H. Goss, Chief, Engineering and Planning; L. B. Dawkins and John B. Cole, Assistant Planning Engineers; Paul H. Walser, State Conservationist of the Soil Conservation Service; and Waters S. Davis, Jr., President-Manager of the State Association of District Supervisors.

The Board minutes of March 16 and 25 were read and approved. The Board approved the practicability and feasibility of the annexation of additional territory to the North Concho River Soil Conservation District No. 208.

They also approved the need for the organization of a soil conservation district in Lavaca County, a public hearing having been held on April 8. They also approved the organization of a soil conservation district in Delta County, a public hearing having been held on April 6. They also determined that the operation of a soil conservation district in Llano County was administratively practicable and feasible, an election having been held on April 23, the vote being 208 - 10.

Upon motion duly passed it was decided that the directors of the State Association of District Supervisors be advised in advance of all State Board meetings and that President-Manager Davis of the Association be furnished with a resume of the minutes of each State Board meeting.

No further business appearing for attention, the Board adjourned at 12:00 noon.
